CLASSES

The school was established in January 1956 under the direction of Kaare and Jean Wilhelmsen.

The school currently conducts classes at two locations. The main campus is located at 20-24 Ruth Avenue, Les Efforts West, San Fernando (opposite San Fernando Open Bible Church).

The North Campus is located at 103 Eastern Main Road, Laventille.

PURPOSE OF OPEN BIBLE INSTITUTE OF THEOLOGY

Open Bible Institute of Theology seeks to provide theological education with a view towards preparing men and women for effective Christian life and ministry as pastors, evangelists, teachers, missionaries and lay-workers committed to God for a particular service.
